Australia leads the way with delirium as a national care standard and there is much best practice delirium care evidence. But vulnerable patients still experience high rates of delirium - up to 60% of older people. One problem is that we don't know who is taking responsibility for delirium care. This workshop provides examples of MDT best practice delirium care models, generated by UOW, to trial in ISLHD.
